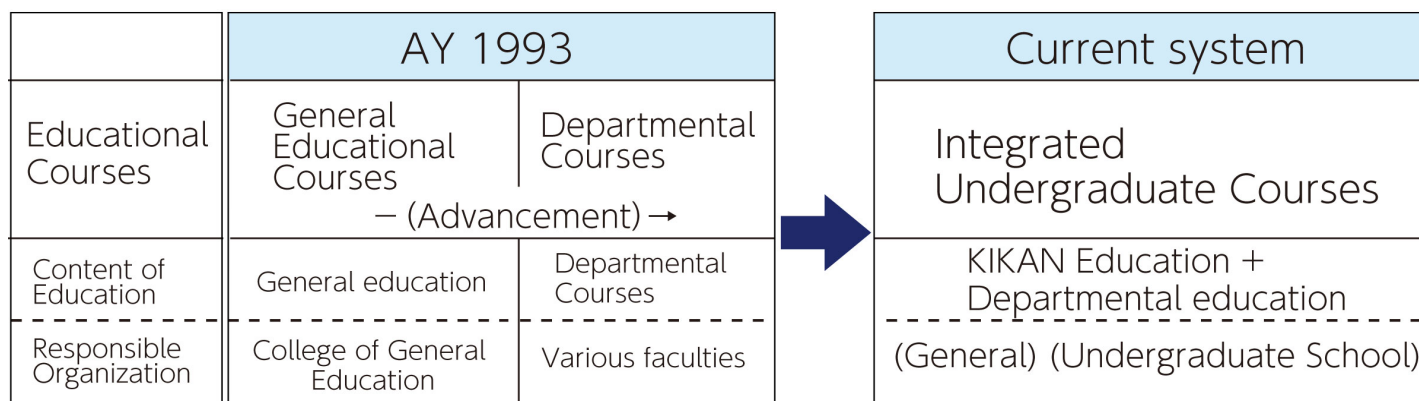


Subjects taught as part of the education offered on bachelor ' s degree courses at University (in other words, education at undergraduate level), can be broadly divided into “ KIKAN Education subjects ” and “ departmental education subjects. ” KIKAN Education and departmental education exist within an organic relationship, to provide consistent education throughout the four years of undergraduate studies at the University (six years in the case of students in the Department of Medicine, School of Medicine, School of Dentistry, and Department of Clinical Pharmacy, School of Pharmaceutical Sciences). Departmental education is implemented by each faculty and department to enhance specialized expertise, while KIKAN Education is conducted university-wide by faculty members from all faculties, research institutes, and centers for common education and research, working collaboratively to leverage the University ' s function as a comprehensive institution. Each undergraduate school and department decides which subjects should be studied, both in KIKAN Education and departmental education, and how many credits are awarded.

Up until 1993, students took general education courses (preliminary courses in the case of students in the Schools of Medicine or Dentistry) within the College of General Education, before moving onto specialist courses within their own undergraduate schools. Subsequent to the closure of the College of General Education, however, undergraduate education has been integrated into the current system, in order to ensure consistency.
